

Notice To Bidders

Sealed proposals will be received by the City of Bishop at the Office of the City Clerk of the City of Bishop, City Hall, 377 West Line Street, Bishop, California, 93514 until three o'clock (3:00) in the afternoon on March 25, 2010, for furnishing all labor, materials, tools, implements and machinery to do and complete all work in a manner satisfactory to the City Engineer, for the following project:

Hanby Avenue Pavement Reconstruction Project

Together with such other incidental items as are necessary to complete the work in the manner and time prescribed and in strict conformity with the contract documents.

At 3:01 in the afternoon on the above date, said proposals will be publicly opened and read aloud.

All proposals shall be made using the forms furnished by the City and shall be enclosed and sealed in an envelope which is addressed to the City Council, Bishop, California, and is clearly labeled:

Bid for Hanby Avenue Pavement Reconstruction Project

Bid books including plans, specifications, bid forms to be used for bidding on this project and other contract documents can be obtained at the City of Bishop City Hall, 377 West Line Street, Bishop, California, 93514 for \$100 for each set. This charge shall not be refunded.

This project is located on Hanby Avenue from East Line Street to East Pine Street. This is a street rehabilitation project consisting of the removal and reconstruction of aggregate base and asphalt concrete approximately 40 feet wide by 1000 feet long including additional paving at intersections with May Street and Willow Street. The project also includes construction of concrete cross-gutters and curb ramps. This project includes furnishing of all labor, implements, tools, machinery, materials and all other work required to complete the project.

The estimated range for the construction cost of this project is \$200,000 to \$300,000.

Bidders are advised that, as required by federal law, the City of Bishop is implementing new Disadvantaged Business Enterprise requirements for Underutilized Disadvantaged Business Enterprises (UDBE) which are covered in the Contract Documents. This project has a Underutilized Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (UDBE) contract goal of 0.5%.

The successful bidder shall furnish all items required in the contract documents.

All proposals shall include prices for all items of work for all construction options contained in the contract documents. The City intends to award the contract to the bidder with the lowest responsive bid for the most extensive construction option the City is able to fund from the allotment available for this project. Responsive bid proposals shall include:

1. Completed Bid Form
2. Bid Bond or other security
3. Completed Affidavit of Non-Collusion form

4. Completed Contractor's Certificate Regarding Worker's Compensation form
5. Completed Proposed Equipment and Material Manufacturers form
6. Completed Proposed Subcontractors form
7. Completed Contractor Licenses form

The City of Bishop hereby notifies all bidders that it will affirmatively ensure that in any contract entered into pursuant to this advertisement, disadvantaged business enterprises will be afforded full opportunity to submit bids in response to this invitation and will not be discriminated against on the grounds of race, color, or national origin in consideration for an award.

The contract is subject to state contract nondiscrimination and compliance requirements pursuant to Government Code, Section 12990.

Attention is directed to "Federal Requirements (American Recovery And Reinvestment Act)," of the Federal Provisions of the Contract Documents.

Pursuant to Section 1773 of the Labor Code, the general prevailing wage rates in the county, or counties, in which the work is to be done have been determined by the Director of the California Department of Industrial Relations. These wages are set forth in the General Prevailing Wage Rates for this project, available at City of Bishop and available from the California Department of Industrial Relations' Internet web site at <http://www.dir.ca.gov/DLSR/PWD>. The Federal minimum wage rates for this project as predetermined by the United States Secretary of Labor are set forth in the Contract Documents and in copies of this document that may be examined at the offices described above where project plans, special provisions, and bid forms may be seen. Addenda to modify the Federal minimum wage rates, if necessary, will be issued to holders of the Contract Documents. Future effective general prevailing wage rates, which have been predetermined and are on file with the California Department of Industrial Relations are referenced but not printed in the general prevailing wage rates.

Attention is directed to the Federal minimum wage rate requirements in the Contract Documents. If there is a difference between the minimum wage rates predetermined by the Secretary of Labor and the general prevailing wage rates determined by the Director of the California Department of Industrial Relations for similar classifications of labor, the Contractor and subcontractors shall pay not less than the higher wage rate. The Department will not accept lower State wage rates not specifically included in the Federal minimum wage determinations. This includes "helper" (or other classifications based on hours of experience) or any other classification not appearing in the Federal wage determinations. Where Federal wage determinations do not contain the State wage rate determination otherwise available for use by the Contractor and subcontractors, the Contractor and subcontractors shall pay not less than the Federal minimum wage rate, which most closely approximates the duties of the employees in question.

The Contractor shall procure all required permits and licenses, pay all charges, fees and taxes, and give all notices necessary and incidental to the due and lawful prosecution of the work.

The City Council of the City of Bishop, California, reserves the right to reject any and all proposals and to waive any formalities in the proposal.
