More Construction on Hanby

While water line work on Hanby Avenue in Bishop moves toward completion, pavement work on the street is set to start in a few weeks.

There is new water line in the ground on Hanby from Line to Pine Street. The contractor on the project, Pacific Engineering, is disinfecting the new water line and testing it for leaks. Connections from the new water line to the properties along the street are being constructed. Once the new water main tests okay properties will be hooked up to the new water line. Finishing the new water line will require additional water shut offs. Residents will be advised in advance of these shutoffs and their planning, cooperation, and patience will be greatly appreciated.

Once the work on the new water line is done on the section between Line and Pine, the contractor will resume constructing new water line north along Hanby from Pine to Yaney. Work on the \$300,000 project is expected to be complete in mid May. Funds for the project come from city water and sewer funds.

Also in mid May, work is expected to begin on the project to repave Hanby Avenue between Line Street and Pine Street – the portion of the street where water line is currently being completed. This pavement project is also expected to cost about \$300,000. Most of the funds for the pavement project come from the federal American Reconstruction and Recovery Act economic stimulus effort.

Parking is restricted during the day Monday through Friday while work is underway and at other times when necessary. Construction materials, equipment, workers, and trenches in the street will require attention and will impact pedestrian and vehicle traffic. There will be ongoing lane and street closures and vehicle access to properties will be restricted at times. All efforts will be made to minimize the impacts and restrictions, but residents, drivers, and pedestrians should be cautious, take alternate routes when available, be alert for hidden hazards, and be patient with some inconvenience and with short delays.
