## **Public Works News Release**

### **Bishop Construction Update**

Emergency sewer construction work on Hanby Avenue in Bishop is expected to be completed the middle of next week and water line construction on Hanby is expected to be completed this week. On the other side of town, work is expected to be completed next week on the sewer project on Keough and Hobson streets. The City of Bishop appreciates resident's and driver's patience with the inconveniences from these projects.

Sewer flows are planned to be diverted into the newly constructed sewer on Hanby today. The rest of this week and the beginning of next sewer service laterals to each property along the street will be replaced. Once those connections are made, the emergency sewer work on Hanby will be complete and work on the repaving project can resume.

Next on the paving project is the completion of grading the street and the placement of gravel base. Once the gravel base is placed and compacted and once concrete gutters and ramps are constructed, the street will be paved. Paving on Hanby is expected in late June.

Also on Hanby, the new waterline and service laterals are in place the full length of Hanby Avenue. The last water line trenches in the pavement are being patched today on Hanby.

On Keough and Hobson streets, the new sewer main is in place and most of the sewer service laterals have been constructed. Sewer service lateral construction is expected to be complete this week on this project and the trenches in the pavement are expected to be patched next week. Patching the pavement is the final work to be done on the Keough and Hobson project.

There will be ongoing lane and street closures and vehicle access to properties will be restricted at times for these projects. All efforts will be made to minimize the impacts and restrictions, but residents, drivers, and pedestrians should be cautious, take alternate routes when available, be alert for hidden hazards, and be patient with some inconvenience and with short delays.
