Bishop Transportation Plan Needs Your Input

The City of Bishop is working on the final draft of the updated transportation plan for the city. To serve the community in the best way possible, your input is needed.


When it is complete, the updated transportation plan will become a part of the city's General Plan and will be called the "Mobility Element" of the General Plan. The entire draft document, and related information including an important "Transportation Report", is available on the city website, www.ca-bishop.us, and is available for review at City Hall. Look at these documents to learn more about the future of transportation in Bishop. A map showing some parts of the updated Mobility Element are on the back of this sheet.

The purpose of the Mobility Element is to define how the City will serve the transportation needs of its residents, businesses and visitors while enhancing its environmental, economic and natural resources. The draft Mobility Element includes many interesting facts and ideas such as:

- Two thirds of the traffic on Main Street is local traffic, one third is through traffic
- New streets east and west of the city should be constructed to reduce traffic on Main Street
- The Wye Road, Park Street, and Grove / East Pine areas each may present opportunities to improve transportation while enhancing the surrounding areas
- A trucks-only route constructed between Bishop and the airport would reduce truck traffic on Main Street
- All streets in Bishop should include sidewalks, with certain exceptions
- Pedestrian, bike, and transit facilities should be expanded

The new Mobility Element and the supporting Transportation Report incorporate significant public input that was gathered at a workshop held during May 2011 and through comments received since. Additional public comment and questions (yours!) are invited on the Mobility Element, the supporting Transportation Report, and anything involving Bishop transportation. Questions and comments can be left on the city website or in person, writing, phone, or email to City Hall, 377 West Line Street in Bishop. In addition, a public meeting is anticipated in mid September.
