ABOUT THE POSITION

The City of Bishop is looking for highly motivated and professional men and women who enjoy working in a picturesque environment. The position of Peace Dispatcher performs a variety of duties involved in the prevention of crime and the enforcement of law and order; participates in and conducts a variety of criminal investigations; provides assistance to special crime prevention and law enforcement programs; and performs a variety of technical and administrative tasks in support of law enforcement services.

ESSENTIAL DUTIES

Receive emergency calls and obtain essential information in order to determine priority, locale, and the appropriate units to be dispatched. Transmit information and orders to, and receive messages from city, allied agencies, and other emergency units; type all radio transmissions received and sent. Make inquiries to local, State, and federal national computer systems to obtain information required by officers in the field or as requested by other law enforcement agencies. Read and interpret maps to locate emergency incidents and determine jurisdiction; may respond to an emergency in the field with communications equipment and set up and operate such equipment.

BENEFITS

A variety of plans are offered through CalPERS. The City contributes up to 90% to active employees and eligible retirees, and the employee pays the difference (10%).

▪ Retiree Health

Employer pays medical benefits to employee and spouse upon retirement.

3% @ 55 (Classic) employees: Current CalPERS members or former CalPERS members without a break of service of more than 180 days.

THE DEPARTMENT

The Bishop Police Department has 19 full-time employees. The Department includes uniformed patrol, investigations, school resource officer, SED, dispatch, records, and evidence.

OTHER REQUIREMENTS

Police 911 Communications Officers are required to work rotating shifts, weekends, nights, holidays, irregular hours, and may be required to work overtime.

Must be able to pass an extensive background check that may include a polygraph, psychological, and medical exam. Candidates with ongoing negative contact with law enforcement will not be considered for hire.

During the probationary period, must be able to complete an intensive hands-on training program that includes; on-the-job training and 120-hours of California Peace Officer Standards and Training (POST) in the basic dispatch academy.

Those who meet the minimum qualifications are invited to apply if you meet the following requirements:

Minimum Qualifications:

Must be at least 18 years of age at time of application and; must have a valid California driver's license at time of appointment; and meet citizenship requirements as defined under California Government Code Sections 1031(a) and 1031.5. Per Government Code Section 1031(e), United States high school graduation, or passage of the General Education Development (GED), or attainment of a two-year or four-year degree from an accredited college or university.
