Park Path Construction Starts Monday

Construction of the City of Bishop Pine to Park Path project is expected to start Monday, 9 June, and last 2 to 4 weeks. Visitors to the back of the Bishop City Park, including the Bishop Community Garden, should expect impacts from the construction.

The Pine to Park Path project will construct an approximate 1,000 foot long paved pedestrian and bicycle path. The path would extend from the north end of two existing alleys north of East Pine Street and east of North Third Street past the Bishop Community Garden to the existing paved path in the park near Spruce Street. Path construction in the area of Spruce Street will include construction of sidewalk and on-street parking improvements.

The Pine to Park Path project is to provide a safe, all-weather bicycle and pedestrian connection between the neighborhood located south of the park and Bishop City Park. The 14-foot wide path is proposed with 8-feet of paving and 3-foot unpaved shoulders.

The \$200,000 project is funded by federal and state gas tax funds as well as funds from the Inyo Local Transportation Commission. The construction contractor is V and C Construction out of Minden, Nevada.

During the construction period, access to some parts of the park, including the Community Garden and Spruce Street, will be affected. It is expected that continuous pedestrian access will be available to the Community Garden, although gardeners are urged to avoid visits during the 7 am to 5 or 6 pm work days. Care and patience from park and garden visitors is appreciated during the construction period.
